## Hughes and Haskell: Beloit Boys of the Silent Service

In late January Vicki Nelson called the Beloit Historical Society. She is a researcher for the USS Bowfin Submarine Museum founded in 1981 and located in Honolulu, Hawaii. The museum is located on the shores of Pearl Harbor conveniently close to the USS Arizona Memorial. Vicki doesn't live there, though it seems she does a lot of visiting. She lives in northern Wisconsin and phoned from there asking if we could provide a photograph of Elmer James Hughes.

The search was on. Looking through drawers, on shelves, paging through scrapbooks and yearbooks and then, naturally, in the last drawer and in the

last scrapbook which was compiled by Mr. & Mrs. Carlton Thompson and donated to the Society in 1980, we found what we were looking for. There on page 24 is a handsome Elmer photograph of Hughes under James the newspaper headline: Finished Submarine School. Along side his photograph is another of Robert Gerald Haskell. They both graduated from Beloit High School in 1940 and from submarine school at New London. Connecticut in 1943. Elmer

"Jimmy" (as they called him in high school) Hughes was a fire controlman on the USS Golet and Robert was a motor machinist on the USS Herring. On page 80 of the scrapbook they are listed among the casualties of war. Both sets of parents got a letter of condolence from the Secretary of the Navy, James Forrestal.

We scanned the photographs and sent them off. Both were appreciated.

Through discussions with Vicki we learned about submariners, the importance of silence in combat, and a project that came to fruition in March of 2005. Started by Charles Hinman who works at the

researching lost submarines and their crews. Talking further with Vicki, and with Charles Hinman, who was kind enough to call from Honolulu, we learned more about submarine warfare.

Charles informed us that during WWII the estimate for the number of sailors who served on submarines

was 18,000 - 24,000; that over 3,600 died in service between 7 December 1941 and 2 September 1945; that the 17-18% casualty rate was the highest in

any branch of service; that when a sub was sunk it was usually with all hands on board; and finally, that submariners who died were considered On Eternal Patrol.

Elmer had a determined look for his Senior class photo of the 1940 Yearbook. He took radio, orchestra, chorus and told those who knew him that he loved to dance. Four years later, after a good deal of schooling, he was serving on the USS Golet in the Pacific. The Golet departed the home base of Midway on 28 May 1944 to patrol the waters off of the northeast coast of the island of Honshu, Japan. It was then to leave those waters on 5 July, reporting back to Midway on the 9th. That didn't happen and the ship was officially reported

missing with all hands 12 July.

Elmer left behind his mom and dad, Mr. & Mrs. Willard Hughes who lived at 540 Public Ave., brothers Warren and Waldo, a step brother Ronald and a sister Pyhllis.

Robert Gerald Haskell has the best smile of any of the seniors on page 34 of the 1940 yearbook. He loved sports, particularly basketball. His nickname was Bibs and he wanted to be a coach. Four years later he was serving on the USS Herring in the Pacific. He left for patrol from Midway a week earlier than Elmer, on 21 May 1944. He and his crew

were to scout the waters around the northern Kuril Islands which were deemed "a likely area for the enemy".
Unlike the Golet, however, the Herring was to rendezvous with the USS Barb on 31 May to determine who was to patrol which areas of this Pacific. It was decided

that the Barb would patrol the south and west, the Herring would cover the north and east. Shortly after this meeting the Barb picked up an enemy survivor from a vessel considered to have been



considered to have been Elmer Hughes sunk by the Herring. All was quiet following this event. Messages were sent to the USS Barb and to the USS Herring requesting a response. Only

the Barb responded. The Herring was expected back at Midway the 3rd of July and when it didn't show the submarine was officially listed as missing on the 5th. Robert left behind parents Mr.

& Mrs. Clifton Haskell who resided at 956 sixth street. There was no mention of brothers and sisters in the newspaper announcement.

Two young graduates from Beloit High School

went off to fight in World War II and died in the depths of the Pacific. They join 161 other Beloiters who died in that war. Hughes and Haskell, though, died in the silent service of the U.S. Military and like Charles Hinman said are now, to this day, On Eternal Patrol.
