## **HISTORY**

"David Lundahl is a photographer / sculptor / musician who lives in southern Wisconsin. He's created an amazing body of work in the last two decades: over 115,000 self-portraits, all taken with a Polaroid SX-70 using natural light manipulated with a series of mirrors and filtered through media such as stencils, scarves, organic matter and transparencies. Though the photographs included below may suggest otherwise, no digital processes were used in the creation of these images. They have a depth that digital devices cannot replicate.

But part of the story here is New Light Studios, the dilapidated farm that Mr. Lundahl rebuilt, largely by himself...

Lundahl works in several media including welded cast iron and photography. "Everyone is creative," he says. "I love to teach people how to bring forth their own self-expression."

"David W. Lundahl, 71, of Beloit, WI, passed away on Saturday, January 30, 2021 in his art studio.

He was born August 10, 1949 in Des Moines, IA. David received his B.A. from Beloit College. He married Sherry Blakeley on October 10, 1985 in Beloit, WI. David worked at Beloit College as a visiting instructor of sculpture. David showed his art in over 40 States and is included in the permanent collections at MOMA and the San Francisco Museum of Modern Art. In 2013, he was inducted into the United Arts Alliance Hall of Fame. David also won the Leonardo DaVinci Prize for his use of light during a solar eclipse. He and coartist Rolf Lund created a sculpture, Phoenix, that is displayed inside First Congregational Church that they sculpted out of metal retrieved from the ashes of the church fire."
