HISTORY

Items collected by Larry Hansen, some of which are connected to Hansen relatives, including Blaine Hansen, who served as the Daily Independent's editor and publisher, and as the president of the Beloit Historical Society.

Scope of Collection

Items relate to Fairbanks-Morse and its predecessor, Beloit's development, Beloit fire department history, Beloit current events as conveyed by reporting in the Beloit Daily Independent from 1923-1934 and in various newspaper clippings, various materials from area churches, Spanish War veteran association rules for ceremonies, and items related to Beloit College's history and collections, Beloit Daily News special editions on the status of the city in 1971 and 1972, and proposed property assessment values dated 1971, 1973, 1981, 1993, and 1996.
