HISTORY

Henry Talmadge (1845-1932) was a restaurant/saloon owner and landlord, who lived in Beloit and Stevens Point, Wi.

Talmadge married Mary Bittinger Mason Talmadge /Moth in 1880, but she appears to have left him for Charles Moth (born 1853) in 1888/89 and then "spent the next years hitting Henry up for as much money as she could wring out of him." (according to the 'Cast of Characters' from the donor) Most of the messages in this collection are from her, and most are asking for money.

Many of Mary's letters also talk about Mary's son, John, (1887-unknown) often simply referred to as "baby". It is unclear who his father was, (Moth or Talmadge) but Henry Talmadge adopted him in the 1880's, with Mary listed as his aunt.

Scope of Collection

The bulk of the collection consists of letters and telegrams sent to Henry Talmadge (1845-1932) restaurant /saloon owner and landlord. Other letters include messages from Moth, discussing ownership of property that may have belonged to Mary. Others are of a more everyday nature, such as letters from Talmadge's aunt, or referring to business matters.
