#### **HISTORY**

Items collected by the Leonard Lange/Doris Barton family, donated to the Beloit Historical Society by daughter Lynn Barton Rasmussen. The bulk of the archival materials consist of World War II ration books issued in the U.S. under conditions of food and fuel shortages from 1942-1946. Administered by the U.S. Office of Price Administration, the rationing program sought to fairly distribute items in short supply across the U.S. population. Over 8,000 local boards were charged with issuing the books to individuals, including infants. Rationed items could not be purchased without the correct ration stamp, and once an individual ran out of stamps for the month, no further purchases could be made until a new ration book was issued for the following month. Rationed items included sugar, coffee, meat, cooking oil, canned goods, and gasoline. Numbers and images on the stamps helped to identify which items the stamps could be used to purchase. Posters and other means were used to educate the population on both legal and wise use of the stamps, and ration book holders were also urged to limit consumption where possible. What was rationed and the appearance of ration books and stamps changed over time. Non-food products, among them as cars and tires, were also rationed, while the food rationing led to the creation of ersatz (substitute) items such as oleo (margarine) for butter.

    Contains unused stamps. Instructions on back cover to salvage ration left over TIN CANS and WASTE FATS so they can be used to make munitions.

  - War Ration Book Two issued to Lynn Annette Lange, age 2 ½ mos. Undated. No remaining stamps.
