FINDING AID

NATIONAL HISTORY

"Soon after the Spanish-American War ended, in early 1899, discharged veterans formed fraternal societies to keep in touch with their former comrades. These included the Spanish War Veterans. At the start of the 20th century, these groups began to merge. In 1904, the three largest groups joined to form the United Spanish War Veterans". This organization was dedicated to preserving the memory of their sacrifices, and to promote patriotism. The patriotic concerns of the United Spanish War Veterans are reflected by references to "Americanism" in their records.

LOCAL HISTORY

The United Spanish War Veterans were represented by the Morris Camp No. 7, in Beloit, Wisconsin. An annual Wisconsin encampment was held every year, including camping out, formal dinners, entertainment, and memorial events. The United Spanish War Veterans, Department of Wisconsin, held their 33rd year encampment in Baraboo No. 40, Wisconsin, June 23-25, 1932. There is a Spanish American War Memorial in Oakwood Cemetery, Beloit, Wisconsin.

SCOPE OF COLLECTION

This is a small collection consisting of three items: Campfire songs from the 33rd Annual Department Encampment of Wisconsin, United Spanish War Veterans from Baraboo, Wisconsin, June 23-25, 1932; and National Auxiliary, United Spanish War Veterans, Voluntary Registration form, "What Can I do to Help My Country?"; and an unidentified ledger of Financial Records (that may or may not belong in the United Spanish War Veterans Collection). It is included in this collection because it contains information concerning the Morris Camp No. 7 Fund.
